Music Notes

"Come to My Window", released in 1993 by Melissa Etheridge, became an anthem to the LGBT+ community. The song's release coincided with her coming out as lesbian. The song was actually written about a complicated relationship she was in, but it remains an important PRIDE anthem 30 years later.

"The Sound of Silence", written by Simon and Garfunkel in 1964, characterizes "silence" not as something peaceful but rather as a detrimental force to which we must stand up. We must dare to disturb the silence by raising our voices against oppression, inequity, and violence.

"Without You", by Jonathan Larson, is a passionate song of love, hope and loss as partners living with AIDS watch their friend Angel die of AIDS. The musical *Rent*, shocking and bold in its time, premiered in 1996. And for the first time, there was a cast of "us" instead of "them". The LGBT+ community and the shadowed community of people living with HIV/AIDS become a beloved chosen community. *Rent* has moved culture forward, hopefully so far that we forget the recent era in which it was something so shocking.
